ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE

The academic year commenced with the declaration of the CBSE Class X Board Examination results, in which the school achieved a 100% pass percentage. Anaya Mishra and Ridhika Rane emerged as school toppers.

Academic planning and implementation were carried out as per the prescribed CBSE curriculum. Continuous assessments, remedial teaching, doubt-clearing sessions, and periodic evaluations were conducted to monitor student progress.

SPORTS

During the academic session 2025–26, the Sports Department organized a wide range of inter-house competitions, district-level participations, and school sports activities from April 2025 to February 2026 to promote physical fitness, teamwork, and sportsmanship among students. Inter-house Chess and Carrom competitions were conducted in April and July, followed by participation in the 69th District Level Tournaments in Basketball (U-17), Badminton (U-14 Boys, U-17 Boys & Girls),

Football (U-14 & U-17 Boys), and Chess (U-19 Boys), along with a Staff vs Students Basketball match during August–September. The U-17 Girls Badminton team secured third position at the district level, and Harshwardhan Sharma (Class XII) was selected for the State Level Chess Tournament. Inter-house Pickle ball competitions and fun races for Nursery to Class II were organized in October, while age-appropriate sports activities for pre-primary and primary students were conducted in November. In December, inter-house Kho-Kho competitions and a friendly inter-school basketball match with Modern School, Talwandi were held. The session concluded with the successful organization of the annual sports meet, Mod-Aletico, in January 2026 for classes Nursery to XI, featuring various track and field events with active participation and strong support from staff and parents.

HOUSE SYSTEM

The school follows a well-organized House System comprising four houses:

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Each house is managed by House Masters, Associate House Masters, House Captains, and Prefects. The house-on-duty system ensures discipline, leadership development, and smooth conduct of daily school activities.

ASSEMBLIES AND CLUB ACTIVITIES

Morning assemblies are conducted regularly to instill discipline, moral values, and a sense of belonging. Theme-based assemblies were introduced, and Best Assembly Awards were given to encourage participation and quality presentations.

The school introduced five clubs namely Theater Club, Abacus, Social Service club, Culinary Club and Eco Club for primary to senior secondary classes to promote creativity, curiosity, and skill development.
